What is Influenza?

The influenza virus causes the “flu”. The flu can cause severe illness in many people. It is spread from person to person by coughing or sneezing.

What are the symptoms of flu?

Symptoms of the flu include fever, cough, headache, extreme tiredness, sore throat, muscle aches. Nausea and Diarrhea are **not** symptoms of the dangerous flu described above. These are symptoms of the “stomach flu” that is caused by other viruses or bacteria.

What is the flu shot?

The flu shot is an inactivated (killed) vaccine. Because the flu shot does not contain live virus...**it cannot give you the flu.**

Who should get the flu shot?

Anyone age 50 or older; anyone with chronic heart, lung, or kidney disease; anyone with diabetes; anyone with reduced resistance to infection; anyone who would like one. You should not get the flu shot if you are allergic to eggs.

How do I get a flu shot at Wausau CBOC?

- You can get one at your regularly scheduled appointment during flu shot season (October through April).
- You can walk into the Flu Shot Clinic at the Wausau CBOC on Tuesdays from 9am to 3pm. This Clinic will run October 18 through the week of December 17th 2010.
